We also saw where Tom Barry stopped the British soldiers and threw a grenade in their truck.. Ms Coakley showed us a gun that was used at the ambush. Then we went back to where the big statue was and we sang a famous song called the 'Boys of Kilmichael'. We had our picture taken and then we got on the bus and returned to school.
